	• Ensuring all operational activities are carried out to maintain the lifeboat and all associated equipment in a constant state of readiness for launching on service			
	Leading the operations team and be a member of and represent operations on the lifeboat management group (LMG)			
	Keeping the LMG chairman regularly appraised of relevant operational matters			
	Liaising and maintaining close links with all local emergency services and representing the RNLI's interests locally in all operational matters			
	Ensuring regular meetings are held with the operations team and encourage open communication			
	• In co-operation with the relevant RNLI personnel, ensuring that the RNLI Competency Based Training (CoBT) requirements for staff and volunteers are fulfilled			
	Being involved in other activities as required
